12 Justices of the Peace Present, Justice Richard Rogers was absent.

Judge Ed Hill called the meeting to order.

Justice Barbara Weinstock inquired about the progress of Bono Lake. Judge Hill said the project was done as far as construction is concerned. Justice Weinstock asked if there was going to be an opening for Bono Lake and Judge Hill replied that this could be a possibility. Justice Ken Stacks suggested that all the original members of the Court; as well as, all that have served since the project started be invited.

Justice Garry Meadows inquired about the railroad easement for the Bono Bridge. Judge Hill briefed the Court on the progress of obtaining a signature required to move forward with the project.

Justice Billie Sue Hoggard asked for an update on the Tax Collector's office where it concerns the amount of taxes collected so far and the amount of delinquent taxes. No one from the Tax Collector's office was present but Assistant to the Judge Tony Thomas said those numbers could be collected for Justice Hoggard. Justice Stacks remarked that this information was sent via email.

Judge Hill reminded the Court of the upcoming AAC Conference in late August and encouraged any Justices that were interested in going to contact the Judge's Office for information.
